Environmental Protection in Poland amidst Transformation and Globalization.

Poland has also been affected by powerful globalization and market and social transformation processes, which has put fundamental challenges, opportunities and threats for environmental protection.

In the world today, one of the most significant replies to the globalization challenge has come from the great inspiring idea of sustainable development, which presupposes an active role for the state at domestic and global scale alike. Some countries, and in particular the EU and international organizations, had undertaken various efforts, yet even so little evident progress has been made globally.
