Edgar Saravia is the World Bank's Country Manager in Poland. He is a Bolivian citizen who has been with the World Bank since August 1997. At the World Bank he has held several technical and managerial positions, including Lead Private Sector Development Specialist, Acting Manager of the Privatization Services Group, Country Manager in Saudi Arabia and since November 2003 Country Manager in Poland.
